
The events will be supported by the Brazilian Embassy in Rome and will be part of the celebrations of the 150th anniversary of Italian immigration to Brazil.

# 150 YEARS OF ITALIAN IMMIGRATION TO BRAZIL



Between the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century, millions of Italians left their homeland in search of opportunities in the Americas, and Brazil was one of their chosen destinations.

The Italian immigration to Brazil, which celebrated its 150th anniversary on February 21, 2024, had a significant impact on Brazilian society and culture. The date marks the arrival in Vitória (ES) in 1874 of the ship La Sofia, which brought around 400 immigrants from the regions of Trento and Veneto.

With strong family ties and a marked contribution to Brazil's diversity and multiculturalism, Italian immigration is celebrated as an integral part of the country's history and identity.

#### **ESSENTIAL TIPS**






Italy's official language is Italian, but there are also minorities of German, French, Slovenian and Ladin speakers. In addition, the majority of the population has a good command of English.



For Brazilians, visas are not required for trips to Italy lasting up to three months. All that is required is a valid passport with at least six months validity from the date of entry into Italy.
